Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission, which comprise the statement of net position as June 30, 2022, and the related statement of revenue, expenses and change in net position, and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal, as of June 30, 2022, and the respective changes in its financial position and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and *Government Auditing Standards* will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and Government Auditing Standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis on pages 5 to 7 be presented to supplement the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and, although not a part of the financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Information

Management is responsible for the other information included in the financial statements. The other information comprises the schedule of the board of commissioners but does not include the financial statements and our auditors' report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements do not cover the other information, and we do not express an opinion or any form of assurance thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and consider whether a material inconsistency exists between the other information and the financial statements, or the other information otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work performed, we conclude that an uncorrected material misstatement of the other information exists, we are required to describe it in our report.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated April 7, 2023 on our consideration of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

Management's Discussion and Analysis June 30, 2022

Introduction

This discussion and analysis is intended to be an introduction to the financial statements and notes that follow this section and should be read in conjunction with them. The Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission ("LCSWDC") is a governmental agency created by Loudon County, the City of Lenoir City and the City of Loudon to operate and manage the Matlock Bend Landfill in Loudon, Tennessee. The Commission also serves as the Municipal Solid Waste Region Board for the Loudon County Solid Waste Region under the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991.

Financial Statement Review

The financial statements herein are comprised of the statement of net position, the statement of revenue, expenses and changes in net position, the statement of cash flows and the accompanying notes to the financial statements.

Financial Highlights as of June 30:

The statement of net position presents information on all LCSWDC's assets and liabilities. Current assets as well as other assets and liabilities are reported in order of their liquidity. The table below presents the significant components of net position:

Results of Operations

LCSWDC shows operating revenue of \$363,076, which represents an increase of \$70,223 from the previous year's operating revenue. At the same time, LCSWDC shows an increase in operating expenses of \$5,737,854 over the previous year's operating expenses. LCSWDC shows a positive change in net position due to lower costs related to Poplar Springs Landfill. The increased utilization of the landfill during the year resulted in a \$221,662 increase to the estimated future liability for closure and post closure costs. This increase to the estimated future liability for closure and post closure costs decreased by \$113,100 from the previous year's increase in estimated costs. As of June 30, 2022, LCSWDC completed its fourteenth full year of operations under its 20-year operations contract that commenced on October 1, 2007 and provides for the turn-key operation of Matlock Bend Landfill by the operator instead of LCSWDC.

The statement of cash flows in the accompanying financial statements is presented using the direct method. This method outlines the sources and uses of cash as it relates to operating income.

Capital Assets

Capital asset levels stayed the same from the prior year. LCSWDC did not purchase capital assets during the year ended June 30, 2022.

Future Events

LCSWDC has engaged in extensive negotiations with the Matlock Bend landfill operator to modify the current operating contract. Over the previous year, LCSWDC and the landfill operator have exchanged multiple drafts of a proposed contract modification. The proposed modifications address the anticipated shortfall of funds for covering the estimated future liability for closure and post-closure costs. Under the current contract, the operator is obligated to perform closure- and post-closure care of all cells in the Matlock Bend landfill which attain final elevation during the contract term. Under the present contract modification proposal, the operator has agreed to perform all closure- and post-closure care for the expanded landfill footprint under a phased closure plan implemented in conjunction with the contract modification. In addition to assuming additional closure and post-closure care obligations, the operator has agreed to provide LCSWDC with a performance bond to satisfy regulatory financial assurance requirements in lien of Loudon County's annual pledge of its assets. We anticipate that the operator will ultimately perform all closure and post-closure care of the landfill during the extended contract term: this change will substantially reduce LCSWDC's long-term liability. The operator is presently in the process of being acquired by another entity, pending government approval. LCSWDC will further evaluate the proposed contract modification if and when this acquisition is completed. In the interim, the operator is submitting a phased closure plan for the landfill to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation for approval. When implemented, the operator's phased closure plan should have some bearing on LCSWDC's estimated future liability for closure and post-closure costs.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

June 30, 2022

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission (the Commission) has been delegated the authority and responsibility for operating the Matlock Bend landfill (the Landfill) under the Amended and Restated Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Agreement dated March 1, 1993, as amended. This agreement was entered into pursuant to state laws requiring the creation of municipal solid waste regions. In addition to specific powers relative to the operation and management of the Landfill, the Commission is granted all the powers and duties of a municipal solid waste region board as set forth in T.C.A. §68-211-813, et seq. The Commission's seven-member board is appointed by the Loudon County mayor (5 members) and the mayors of City of Loudon, Tennessee (1 member) and Lenoir City, Tennessee (1 member).

The Commission has contracted with Republic Services (originally Santek Environmental, Inc. which was acquired by Republic and hereafter referred to as Republic) to operate the Landfill. Republic is responsible for the operation of Phase II/IV of the Landfill and the closure and postclosure of Phases I and II/IV during the term of the contract, which expires on September 30, 2027. Phase I of the Landfill was closed during the year ended June 30, 1996 and closure was approved by the State of Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation during fiscal year ended June 30, 1998. Phase III was never developed.

The Poplar Springs Landfill was operated by another government and was closed before the Commission was created. While the Commission has no direct responsibility for any ongoing post closure care of the landfill, the board has agreed to pay certain costs using funds that were donated to the Commission when it was created.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Commission's financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, all assets and liabilities (whether current or noncurrent) are included in the statement of net position. The statement of revenue, expenses and change in net position presents increases (revenue) and decreases (expenses) in total net position. Under the accrual basis of accounting, revenue is recognized in the period in which it is earned while expenses are recognized in the period in which the liability is incurred.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(continued)

June 30, 2022

The Commission recognizes revenue when it is earned and measurable, and expenses are recognized when the liability is incurred. Surcharge revenue and revenue for closure and postclosure security fees are classified as operating revenue. All other revenue is reported as nonoperating revenue. Operating expenses are those expenses that are essential to the primary operations. All other expenses are reported as nonoperating expenses.

The Commission prepares its financial statements in accordance with GASB Statement No. 34, Basic Financial Statements-and Management's Discussion and Analysis-for State and Local Governments GASB Statement No. 34 establishes standards for external financial reporting for state and local governments and requires that resources be classified for accounting reporting purposes into the following three net position groups:

Investment in Capital Assets

This category includes capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation and outstanding principal balances of debt attributable to the acquisition, construction, or improvement of those assets. The Commission had no debt as of June 30, 2022. Investment in capital assets at June 30, 2022 has been calculated as follows:

<u>Restricted:</u> This category includes net position whose use is subject to externally imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Commission pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Commission's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted recourses as needed. The Commission had no restricted net position as of June 30, 2022.

<u>Unrestricted:</u> This category includes net position that is not subject to externally imposed stipulations and that do not meet the definition of "Restricted" or "Investment in Capital Assets". Unrestricted net position may be designated for specific purposes by action of management or the Board of Commissioners or may otherwise be limited by contractual agreements with outside parties. The Commission had a deficit of unrestricted, undesignated net position of \$8,188,420 as of June 30, 2022.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(continued)

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable which are deemed uncollectible based upon a periodic review of the accounts are charged to revenue. At June 30, 2022 no allowance for uncollectible accounts was considered necessary.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment is recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives, which range from ten to twenty years. The Commission has not adopted a formal capitalization policy.

NOTE C - CASH

Cash represents money on deposit in various banks. The Commission considers all highly liquid investments with an original maturity date of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

State of Tennessee law authorizes the Commission to invest in obligations of the United States of America or its agencies, nonconvertible debt securities of certain federal agencies, other obligations guaranteed as to principal and interest by the United States of America or any of its agencies, secured certificates of deposit and other evidences of deposit in state and federal banks and savings and loan associations, and the Tennessee Department of Treasury Local Government Investment Pool (the LGIP). The LGIP contains investments in certificates of deposit, U.S. Treasury securities and repurchase agreements, backed by the U.S. Treasury securities. The Treasurer of the State of Tennessee administers the investment pool.

All deposits with financial institutions in excess of Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) limits are required to be secured by one of two methods. Excess funds can be deposited with a financial institution that participates in the State of Tennessee Bank Collateral Pool. For deposits with financial institutions that do not participate in the State of Tennessee Bank Collateral Pool, state statutes require that all deposits be collateralized with collateral whose market value is equal to 105 percent of the uninsured amount of the deposits.

The Commission's cash and investments at June 30, 2022 are held by the Loudon County Trustee in the Commission's name and are entirely insured through the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the State of Tennessee Bank Collateral Pool.

Cash received by the Commission for closure and postclosure security fees totaled \$2,749,219 as of June 30, 2022. Management intends to use this cash to partially satisfy the closure/post-closure costs described in Note G.

NOTE E - RISK MANAGEMENT

The Commission is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. The Landfill operator, on behalf of the Commission carries commercial insurance for various risks of loss, including general liability coverage. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three fiscal years.

NOTE F - COMMITMENTS

The Commission has completed fifteen full years of operations under its operations contract with its operator dated as of July 1, 2007, which provides for the turnkey operations of the Landfill by the Commission's existing operator, Republic, commencing on October 1, 2007. The prior operations agreement dated April 5, 1994 was amended on June 19, 2007 to provide for the termination of that contract effective September 30, 2007. The current operations agreement provides for a twenty-year term ending on September 30, 2027. Under the previous contract, the Commission received all tipping fee revenue and contracted with Republic to operate the Landfill. In accordance with the current agreement, Republic receives all revenue for tipping fees, pays operating costs of the Landfill, and pays a host fee and closure/postclosure fees to the Commission.

NOTE G - CLOSURE AND POSTCLOSURE CARE COST

State and federal laws and regulations require a final cover to be placed on the Landfill site when it stops accepting waste and to perform certain maintenance and monitoring functions at the site for a minimum of thirty years after closure. Phase I of the Landfill was closed during the year ended June 30, 1996. However, state certification of closure was not approved until the year ended June 30, 1998.

Although closure and postclosure care costs will be paid only near or after the date that the Landfill stops accepting waste, the Commission reports a portion of these closure and postclosure care costs as an operating expense in each period based on Landfill capacity used as of the date of the statement of net position. Landfill facilities operation expense reported in the accompanying financial statements consists of \$5,913,561 for the current year increase in the estimated liability for closure and postclosure costs.

The liabilities were estimated based on information provided by the State of Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation when the corresponding cells of the Landfill were initially permitted. Closure and postclosure costs related to Phase I were recognized by the Commission in prior periods based on Landfill capacity as of the date of each statement of net position. The liability for Phase II/IV represents the estimated cumulative amount of closure and postclosure care costs reported to date based on the use of 97.0% of the estimated capacity of the Landfill for that phase. The Commission will recognize the remaining estimated cost of \$392,247 as the remaining permitted capacity of the Landfill is filled. These amounts are based on what it would cost to perform all closure and postclosure care in 2022. The Commission expects to close Phase II/IV of the Landfill in August of 2030 (assuming 80,000 tons of waste per year). The Commission is seeking a permit modification which would extend the life of the landfill and result in a new phase. Actual costs of closure and postclosure may vary based on inflation, deflation, technology, or applicable laws and regulations.

Loudon County, Tennessee (the County) has entered into a Contracts in Lieu of Performance Bond with the State of Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation for Phase I (dated February 24, 1994) and for Phase II/IV (dated September 1, 1997), which are amended from time to time. In the event the County fails to perform closure and postclosure care requirements pursuant to all applicable laws, statutes, rules and regulations as such laws, rules, statutes and regulations may be amended, the contracts pledge future revenues of the County, disbursed from the State of Tennessee to the County, up to the amount of \$13,380,389 (covering all phases of the Landfill) as of June 30, 2022, for closure and postclosure care.

NOTE H – SUBSEQUENT EVENT

In July 2022, the Commission and Republic modified their contract to extend the term of the contract to December 31, 2027 with automatic extensions up to December 31, 2038. In addition, the amended contract requires.....

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States of America, the financial statements of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission, which comprise the statement of net position as of June 30, 2022, and the related statements of revenue, expenses and change in net position, and cash flows for the year then ended and the related notes to the financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated April 7, 2023.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's financial statements will not be prevented or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

herein below. NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises, and other

good and valuable consideration, the Commission, acting by and through its members,

hereby amends its Bylaws as follows:

BYLAWS OF THE

LOUDON COUNTY SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL COMMISSION

ARTICLE I

LOUDON COUNTY SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL COMMISSION

Section 1. NAME

The name of the Commission shall be the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission.

Section 2. AUTHORITY

The Commission and its authority are established by Loudon County, Lenoir City and the City of Loudon pursuant to an Amended and Restated Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Agreement dated March 1, 1993 (the "Interlocal Government Agreement") entered into pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act codified at T.C.A. 12-9-101 et seq. and the Solid Waste Management Act codified at 68-21 1-80 t et seq. These Bylaws are adopted pursuant to Section 5 of the Interlocal Government Agreement.

Section 3. PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION

The Commission shall have the purposes described in Section 4 of the Interlocal Government Agreement. which shall include:

- A. The overall supervision of the Matlock Bend Sanitary Landfill to include the following.
 - (1) Establishing policies for the operation and management of the landfill to include major capital expenditures;
 - (2). Raising and lowering of tipping fees and other charges assessed for the use of the landfill;
 - (3). Daily operation and management of the landfill and the letting and supervision of all operational agreements for the landfill;
 - (4). Making all policy decisions relative to purchasing unbudgeted capital items, expending major sums of money, and obligating the Commission to any contracts for more than one year; and
 - (5). Making decisions as to what organizations, businesses, and parties may use the landfill and any other disposal facilities operated by the Commission; and

- (6) Conducting the business of the Commission in accordance with the policies and procedures of Loudon County. This includes but is not limited to procurement/purchasing, records management, budgeting, audits and legal guidance.
- B. The periodic review, and study if necessary, of the solid waste disposal problems and needs of Loudon County, and making recommendations to Loudon County, Lenoir City and the City of Loudon related thereto.
- C. All responsibilities of a municipal solid waste region board by virtue of state law and applicable regulations.
- D. Develop and implement a ten—year solid waste management plan in accordance with T.C.A. 68—211—801 et seq. [Intergovernmental Agreement]

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION

There shall be seven (7) members of the Commission, who shall be referred to as Commissioners. Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Loudon County Mayor and approved by the Loudon County Commission, and one (1) member shall be appointed by the Mayors of the cities of Lenoir City and Loudon, and approved by the respective city councils of those cities. Commissioners may be removed the Commission at any time by the appointing government authority.

Section 2. TERM OF MEMBERS

The three original Commission members (appointed by the two City Mayors and the County Mayor) shall each serve initial six (6) year terms (Panel A); two of the Commission members appointed by the County Mayor shall each serve initial four (4) year terms (Panel B); and two of the Commission members appointed by the County Mayor shall each serve initial two (2) year terms (Panel C); all initial terms to commence on March I, 1993. After their respective initial terms, all Commission members shall each serve six (6) year terms

and shall be appointed on a staggered basis according to the panel designated above.

Commissioners shall continue to serve until their respective successors are appointed.

Section 3. VACANCIES

No vacancy on the Commission shall impair the right of a quorum to exercise all rights and perform all the duties of the Commission. A vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority of the vacant Commission seat for the unexpired portion of the vacant term.

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS

Section 1. SCHEDULE

Until and unless otherwise established by action of the Commission, the Commission will hold its regular meetings on the second Tuesday of every month at the for Loudon City Municipal Building located at 2480 Highway 72, Loudon, Tennessee. The standard meeting time for the Commission shall be 6:00 p.m. Whenever the Commission

wishes to change the time of a regular meeting because of holiday, the anticipated lack of a quorum, or for any other reason, the Commission may by motion duly adopted at any meeting change the time of holding any subsequent regular meeting to any hour and any day that is stated in such motion. In such event, the changed meeting shall be noticed as if it were a special meeting pursuant to Article III, Section 2. [Bylaws Amendment 1]

Until and unless otherwise established by action of the Commission, the

Commission will hold its regular meetings on the second Tuesday of every month at the

Loudon County

Courthouse Annex located at 1 0 1 Mulberry Street in Loudon, Tennessee. The standard-meeting time for the Commission shall be 6:30 p.m. Whenever the Commission wishes to change the time of a regular meeting because of holiday, the anticipated lack of a quorum, or for any other reason, the Commission may by motion duly adopted at any meeting change the time of holding any subsequent regular meeting to any hour and any day that is stated in such motion. In such event, the changed meeting shall be noticed as if it were a special meeting pursuant to Article III, Section 2.

Section 2. SPECIAL MEETINGS

Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by any two (2) Commissioners by giving reasonable notice of the time and place of such meeting to all Commissioners. The notice must be in writing. No business other than that specifically mentioned in the notice for such meeting shall be transacted. The notice for a special meeting may be served by any Commissioner, by any authorized attorney, agent or employee under the direction of the Commission, or by any police officer or any person authorized to serve civil process issued by the courts of the State of Tennessee.

Section 3. NOTICE

Notice to the public of all meetings, including special meetings, shall be given by written notice delivered to a newspaper of general circulation in Loudon County and notification on the Loudon County Website. [Bylaws Amendment 2]

Notice to the public of all meetings, including special meetings, shall be given by a written notice delivered to the News-Herald.

Section 4. -QUORUM

A quorum is defined as the personal presence of at least four (4) members, and at least four (4) affirmative votes are required before any action can be adopted. A quorum cannot be established through a telecon. [MTAS Guidance]

Section 5. RULES OF ORDER

Meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 6. MINUTES

Adequate written minutes shall be kept recording the official acts and proceedings at all meetings of the Commission. Minutes shall be presented for approval or correction at a subsequent meeting and upon approval shall be signed by the Chair or Secretary and filed with the minutes of the Commission, which shall be maintained and archived in accordance with Loudon County records policies and procedures. kept permanently.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

Section 1. OFFICERS TERM AND ELECTION

The Commission shall elect a Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary from its membership, who shall each serve for terms of two (2) years each. The Commission shall normally elect its officers in its first scheduled meeting after March 1st of each odd numbered year. The election can be delayed as necessary if approved by the Commission.

Section 2. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

A. Chair

The Chair shall have the general and active management of the Commission's business and shall exercise general supervision and direction over all of the affairs of the Commission. Unless another officer or person is designated to execute the instrument, the Chair shall execute on behalf of the Commission all documents, contracts, resolutions, etc., approved by the Commission at its official meetings. The Chair shall insure ensure that a

quorum is present at meetings before taking any official action. The Chair shall see that the open meeting law commonly referred to as the "Sunshine Law" is observed.

The Chair may delegate duties as necessary to other members of the Commission.

Delegations shall be in writing with duties and responsibilities defined, approved by the

Commission and recorded in the meeting minutes.

B. Vice-Chair

The Vice-Chair shall, in the absence or disability of the Chair, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair.

C. Secretary

The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping the minutes of the Commission, shall attest to the authorized execution of any documents approved by the Commission and shall perform such other duties as may be required by the Commission. The Secretary duties may be performed by someone other than a Commissioner.

Section 3. REMOVAL OF OFFICERS

All officers of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Commission and may be removed at any time during their term by a two-thirds vote of the Commission.

ARTICLE V

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

An amendment to the Bylaws may be proposed at any regular meeting of the

Commission, but shall not be voted on at the meeting at which proposed. At any subsequent regular meeting, the proposed amendment, as originally proposed or as amended, may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Commission. When a proposed amendment to the Bylaws receives the negative vote of a majority of the Commission, no further action can be taken on such proposed amendment at that meeting, although the same or a similar amendment may again be proposed at a later meeting.

ARTICLE VI

CODE OF ETHICS

The Code of Ethics for Loudon County, Resolution No. 020507, on February 5, 2007 and any amendments to that resolution is hereby designated as the ethical standards for the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission.

Adopted: May 9, 2006 TBD, 2023

12.18 Prohibition Against Collusion. The Contractor represents and agrees that it has not conveyed or offered or promised, directly or indirectly, to any member of the Commission, employee, agent or representative of the Commission, or any person representing or purporting to represent the Commission, or any family member including spouse, parents, or children of the foregoing group, any remuneration, property, service, advantage or other consideration or benefit of value, to improperly influence or obtain the award of this Agreement to Contractor. Contractor further agrees that it shall not employ as an employee, agent, consultant or independent contractor any member of such group for a period of five (5) years from the Commencement Date. XIII. MISCELLANEOUS

- 13.1 Complete Agreement; Amendments. This Agreement, including its Exhibit, represents the complete agreement between the parties, and it supersedes all prior agreements, requests for proposals, proposals, and all prior written or oral commitments, arrangements or understandings with respect thereto. There are no representations, restrictions, agreements, promises, inducements, statements of intentions, warranties, covenants or undertakings with respect to the transactions contemplated thereby other than those expressly set forth therein. This Agreement cannot be amended, modified or supplemented by any of the parties in any respect except by a subsequent written contract entered into by both parties
- 13.2 <u>Section Headings</u>. The section or paragraph headings are used only for convenience and are not to be used in determining the intent of the parties or in otherwise interpreting this Agreement.
- 13.3 Provisions Unenforceable. If any provision of Agreement shall be declared illegal, void or unenforceable, the other provisions shall not be affected but shall remain in full force and effect, unless the resulting interpretation of the Agreement shall materially alter the obligations of either party so as to work an unfair hardship on such party (the "Burdened Party"), in which case the Burdened Party shall have the option to request a renegotiation of the Agreement and/or to terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days advance written notice to the other party. 

To Whom It May Concern:

The Tennessee Department of Transportation ("TDOT") has received several complaints regarding mud being deposited on State Route 72 near the entrance to the above-referenced property in Loudon County which contains the Matlock Bend Sanitary Landfill ("Landfill"). It is TDOT's understanding that the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission ("Commission") is the owner of this property and has entered into a Sanitary Landfill Operation Agreement with Santek Environmental, LLC for it to operate the Landfill.

Please be advised that TDOT is concerned that the material being deposited on State Route 72 may become a safety issue and could affect the integrity of the subject roadway. To that end, TDOT requests the Commission's cooperation in preventing potential damage to State Route 72 by requiring your contractor to comply with its contractual maintenance responsibilities to remove any litter, runoff, dirt, mud, debris or other foreign material on State Route 72 at this location caused by its access to and use of the Landfill. TDOT will be glad to discuss this issue with representatives of the Commission, as well as your contractor, in an effort to reach a resolution to this on-going maintenance problem.

From the discussion at the Loudon Landfill Commission Workshop on February 9th, you ask for an updated expansion schedule of the one submitted in January of 2022 by Mr. Classen. For simplicity and consistency reasons, we are going to stay with the schedule Mr. Classen submitted in his letter of January 12, 2023, on page 4 of the document.

Working backwards from the date additional airspace is needed, below is the critical path timeline without which the citizens of Loudon County will no longer have an economical, safe, and environmentally compliant local disposal option:

November 2024 Permitted disposal capacity fully depleted at current tonnages —

Landfill closes without expansion

April 2024 Begin Construction of new cell (currently not permitted)

March 2024 Earliest anticipated TDEC approval of expansion permit application

January 2024 Begin public comment period, culmination of TDEC review period

September 2023 Preliminary TDEC review and response to regulatory comments

April 2023 Submit Part II permit application to TDEC – requires Commission Approval

March 2023 Earliest anticipated TDEC approval of hydrogeological report

2023 January Submit Part I permit application to TDEC – requires Commission Approval

Concurrently, submit hydrogeological report for TDEC review and approval



Enclosed, please find the Annual Engineering Report (AER) for Matlock Bend Landfill.

Please note that the Remaining Constructed Life (Section C.10.) and Remaining Permitted Life (Section C.8.) were calculated using the permitted design capacity and the remaining constructed capacity respectively. Both volumes were reduced to account for the Volume of Fill Above Permitted Waste Grades (Section C.13.). Along with the reduced volumes, an anticipated tonnage of 640 tons per operational day and a 3-year average composite waste density of 1,632 lbs/cy were utilized to calculate the remaining permitted and constructed years of life for the landfill.

The Site Survey Control Points shown on the FIRMATEK drawing dated December 15, 2022 are control points provided by PLS and based on the original data supplied to PLS.



At the request of the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission (LCSWDC), Santek Environmental, LLC (Santek) has prepared this letter to respond to a memo prepared by Mr. Richard Anklin and presented to the Commission at its Thursday, April 20, 2023 meeting. In Mr. Anklin's memo he asserts the constructed remaining airspace calculations we have provided — calculations which were prepared by a Tennessee-licensed professional land surveyor and a Tennessee-licensed professional engineer using the process required by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation Division of Solid Waste Management (TDEC) (which is used at all 200 active landfills in the Republic Services portfolio), and audited by our third-party certified public accounting firm, Ernst and Young—are incorrect.


Before moving into an explanation for why Mr. Anklin's assessment is not accurate, one salient point must be made as clearly as possible: even if the date the Matlock Bend Landfill is projected to fully deplete its airspace is sometime in mid-2025, as Mr. Ankliln argues, the Commission is still extremely late in beginning the application process for permit expansion, and has therefore created a risk of prematurely reaching capacity and causing the associated public health crisis which may follow. Airspace capacity calculations are not exact predictions because of the many variables associated with fluctuations in density and daily waste acceptance. It is possible the actual date of airspace depletion could be several months later or several months sooner than the November 2024 date we have communicated. Under any scenario, the Matlock Bend Landfill is behind in the required permitting process.

Turning to his memorandum, Mr. Anklin essentially claims the remaining capacity calculations are incorrect due to three flaws: (1) daily tonnage, (2) density, (3) and final geometry of waste grades.

Daily Tonnage

Daily tonnage receipts is a number that varies widely and can have a significant impact on airspace capacity calculations. Mr. Anklin asserts 455 tons per day (tpd) is the correct number, whereas in our calculation we use 640 tpd. Respectfully, recent data does not support Mr. Anklin's number.

In the month of April, our average daily inbound tonnage was 610 tons. The chart below shows the average daily tonnage by month since December 2022, with a clear increasing trend projected to exceed 640 tpd in May. We are always actively pursuing new customers, as is our contractual right and obligation as operator of this landfill, and have been particularly successful in doing so over the past six weeks. Within the next few weeks and months, we anticipate adding several additional large customers which will likely push our daily waste acceptance rate above 700 tpd and further accelerate the date of projected airspace depletion. In short, 640 tpd is an appropriate number to use for daily tonnage in creating remaining capacity projections.



Average Daily Tonnage at Matlock Bend Landfill

As an industry convention, we use 286 days per year as the multiplier to convert daily average tonnage into annual projections, which represents 5.5 days per week due to the fact tonnage on Saturdays is usually half or less of a normal workday. This means the correct number for total annual tonnage to be used in airspace calculations is no less than 640 tons/day x 286 days = 183,040 tons (recall our contractual annual tonnage cap is 292,000 tons, so there remains significant opportunity to increase tonnage).

Density

Similar to average daily tonnage, total composite waste density is a number which varies widely based on a number of variables including waste type, heavy equipment operational run-time, elevation of fill, and location of fill. In our calculations we used a waste density of 1,632 pounds per cubic yard (lb/CY), which is the three-year average density for Matlock Bend calculated through a rigorous annual process by our team of third-party licensed professionals. Using a three-year average is a standard followed industrywide and provides a smoothing effect for one-year anomalies in this highly variable number.

Mr. Anklin suggests a waste density value of 1,455 lb/CY is more appropriate given the history of the site. While his number is does not square with verified data from the site, if we use this decreased density value, the airspace depletion date actually accelerates by three months to August 2024, because less dense waste would fill the available space faster. This contradicts his assertion there is an extra 13 months of airspace beyond that currently projected in our calculations.

Final Geometry of Waste Grades

As part of Mr. Anklin's memo, he generated figures with various cross-sections which show remaining waste fill elevations ranging from 0 feet to 30 feet, and uses this as the basis to conclude there is more airspace available than our engineering analysis states. The cross-sections Mr. Anklin provided are not dimensionally accurate, show proposed waste grades extending outside the permitted waste footprint (which is not legal or constructable), and do not reflect an understanding of the details of physical limitations governing landfill construction (does not consider base liner elevations, limitations on placing thin sliver fills of waste, etc.).

As a response, we have attempted to mimic Mr. Anklin's cross-sections with a series of four drawings of our own, which are attached and described below. These figures are dimensionally accurate to replicate current conditions and permitted final elevations.

- Drawing 1 is a tick map showing the elevation difference between permitted top of waste grades and the December 2022 aerial survey from the Annual Engineering Report for Reporting Year 2022 (submitted to TDEC on April 25, 2023). Numbers in red indicate areas of historic waste overfill which must be relocated or repermitted prior to final closure and therefore count against the remaining airspace capacity number. Numbers in black indicate areas of remaining waste fill capacity. Generally speaking, any area with four feet or less of remaining fill capacity on sideslopes or older portions of the landfill cannot and will not be filled the damage that could be caused to already stabilized areas of the landfill and the operational difficulty of working in these precarious areas means the "juice" is not worth the "squeeze." Cross Sections A, B, and C are shown on this drawing to be able to trace the remaining waste height for presentation purposes.
- Drawing 2 shows cross-section A cutting through the southernmost peak of the existing landfill slope. There are portions of the section where the existing landfill surface is at or above (overfill) permitted top of waste (which is not reflected in Anklin's memo). There are two small approximately 100-foot horizontal sections along the side slope and at the peak of the slope which will get captured with approximately 10 feet of waste placement, but the total waste fill volume this yields is modest. Overall, except for the two approximate 100-foot x 10-foot sections, this area of the landfill is already at or near permitted top of waste grades.
- Drawing 3 shows cross-section B cutting through the centermost peak of the existing waste mass.
 There is available airspace in this section but it is at most 10-feet in thickness, including at the peak elevation of 1,090 feet. Of note on this drawing is the area shaded green, which represents

the airspace sacrificed by lowering the maximum waste elevation 24 feet to elevation 1,090 msl as required by the Second Amendment.

• Drawing 4 shows cross-section C cutting through the northernmost section of the existing landfill, including the area currently being filled. This section represents most of the remaining airspace capacity through the permitted life of the landfill. The area shaded green represents area that is technically permitted, but which will not be constructed under the Second Amendment and is therefore not available. This green-shaded airspace is associated with a berm on the exterior of Module H which is in the current permit, but was not constructed because it would impede the ability for the proposed horizontal expansion to tie-in to the existing base liner system. This decision was anticipated in the Second Amendment and was made with the expectation the Commission would be proceeding with timely submittal of the horizontal expansion permit application.

We look forward to presenting this information at the Commission workshop Thursday May 11, answering any questions you may have, and hopefully resolving the perceived discrepancy on this matter once and for all. If there is any information the Commission believes is missing from this response, please let us know as soon as possible, and we will work to provide the information expeditiously. We look forward to continuing to work with the Commission and move the expansion application forward.

Enclosed, please find the revised Annual Engineering Report (AER) for Matlock Bend Landfill. We noticed during internal discussions that Section C.4. and C.12. had not been adjusted appropriately for the Volume of Fill Above Permitted Waste Grades as stated below.

Please note that the Remaining Constructed Life (Section C.10.) and Remaining Permitted Life (Section C.12.) were calculated using the permitted design capacity and the remaining constructed capacity, respectively. Both volumes were reduced to account for the Volume of Fill Above Permitted Waste Grades (Section C.13.). Along with the reduced volumes, an anticipated tonnage of 640 tons per operational day and a 3-year average composite waste density of 1,632 lbs/cy were utilized to calculate the remaining permitted and constructed years of life for the landfill.



Santek Environmental, LLC (Santek) has prepared this letter to provide an update to the CAP action items submitted to TDEC on March 15, 2023. The CAP identified action items and a schedule for reducing sediment track-out onto Highway 72, establish the appropriate stream buffer, and install and maintain effective erosion prevention and sediment control measures on-site to minimize the potential for sediment discharge to the unnamed tributary of Watts Bar Reservoir. Below details the corrective actions taken and completed for the items during the months of March, April, and ongoing in May per the CAP.

March:

Install Rock Checks Downgradient of the Tire Wash

Santek installed the rock checks downgradient of the tire wash prior to March 31st in accordance
with the CAP schedule. The rock checks are inspected after each rain event to confirm proper
functionality.

Sediment Pond Engineering Evaluation

- Santek contracted Promus Engineering, LLC to complete an engineering evaluation of Sediment Pond #2 which was provided to Santek on March 31, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The evaluation is attached below. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements could be implemented. Below is a summary of the evaluation and recommended modifications which are scheduled to be completed by June 30, 2023.
 - Plug the opening in the bottom of the riser to enable the pond to retain a greater volume of stormwater.
 - o Install a floating skimmer to provide extended detention to increase hydraulic residence time.
 - o Install a sediment gauge in the pond that will mark the sediment.
 - Continue regular pond maintenance to include, but not be limited to, mowing the slopes, removing trees and brush from the inside slopes and outer berm, regularly removing sediment from the pond, and removing blockages in the skimmer.

From analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway.

April:

Construct New Access Road to Active Area

- A new landfill access road has been constructed as of April 30, 2023, following the placement of
 the initial lift of waste across the active cell in accordance with the CAP schedule. The access road
 was installed in accordance with the operational waste fill plan for the Facility.
 - In addition, stone is regularly refreshed along the roads leading to and from the active filling areas to help prevent mud/sediment tracking prior to the tire wash and traffic controls are actively enforced to restrict vehicle to stabilized areas.

Evaluation of Tire Wash by Manufacturer

- Santek reached out to the tire wash manufacturer, Moby Dick, to perform an evaluation of the functionality and sediment removal issues of the tire wash. Moby Dick conducted a site visit and provided their evaluation on April 28, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule.
 - o From calculations based on the trucks received per day, Moby Dick evaluated that there is adequate water capacity for the tire wash but that it needs to be regularly cleaned and maintained. Moby Dick provided a maintenance agreement to Santek on May 1, 2023, and the tire wash has since been cleaned out with a vacuum truck and floc system maintenance on May 5, 2023. Santek will continue cleaning and maintaining the tire wash monthly and will likely utilize Moby Dick for the services following processing of the maintenance agreement.

Stabilize Disturbed Area near the Tire Wash

• The stabilization of the disturbed areas around the tire wash was completed before May 1, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. Santek placed seed and strawing in the affected areas to help minimize erosion and sedimentation in the area.

Remove Sediment and Install Sediment Controls Downgrade of the Scale House

- Accumulated sediment had been removed and straw wattles were installed downgrade of the scale
 house as of April 10, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The straw wattles help trap
 sediment and minimize migration to the outfall point, SO-2.
 - o In addition, regular sweeping either by hand or with the pavement sweeper occurs daily in this area to help minimize sediment accumulation.

May:

Install Sediment Controls on the East Slope

A stormwater diversion berm and two 24-inch down drainpipes have been installed on the Eastern slope of the Facility as of May 4, 2023. Seeding and temporary stabilization of the slope is currently underway per our stormwater management plan. The timeline for completion of these items is the end of May 2023 which should meet the CAP timeline of June 30, 2023, required well in advance.

In response to the Notice of Violation (NOV) dated February 16, 2023, and in accordance with the corresponding Corrective Action Plan (CAP) prepared by Promus Engineering, LLC (Promus) dated March 15, 2023, we have conducted an evaluation of existing Sediment Pond #2 at the above-referced facility. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/ improvements can be implemented to improve sediment removal efficiency.

EXISTING POND CONDITIONS

At the time of our March 3, 2023 site visit, which was subsequent to approximately 2 inches of precipitation over the previous 36 hours, the water elevation in the pond appeared to be relatively low. The bottom portion of the riser was submerged at the time of the site visit. As noted in the CAP, Sediment Pond #2 does not appear to be detaining influent stormwater for a time period that is adequate to promote settlement of the suspended solids. Design guidelines for sediment removal require that ponds slowly release a specific volume of water to allow time for suspended solids to settle to the bottom of the pond. Following is a summary of the observations of the as-built pond condition:

- The bottom of the pond was submerged at the time of the site visit, but it appears there is an orifice near the bottom of the riser that is causing short-circuiting in the pond.
- The pond appears to have been constructed to provide an adequate storage capacity to provide extended detention time for smaller, more frequent storm events. The current riser configuration does not appear to allow the pond to make use of this volume. To the extent possible, the proposed modifications in the following summary

items will maximize the storage capacity used and will provide extended detention time. These modifications should result in improved sediment removal efficiency.

RECOMMENDED MODIFICATIONS

We conducted an evaluation of the pond using Hydraflow Hydrographs, which is a software that uses various industry-standard and government agency design methodologies to analyze surface water hydrology, stormwater conveyance features, and sediment/detention ponds. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements can be implemented. Following is a summary of our evaluation and recommended modifications:

- We recommend plugging the opening in the bottom of the riser to enable the pond to retain a greater volume of stormwater.
- We recommend installing a floating skimmer to provide extended detention to increase hydraulic residence time.
- We recommend installing a sediment gauge in the pond that will mark the sediment depth at which pond cleaning should occur.
- We recommend continued regular pond maintenance to include, but not be limited to, mowing the slopes, removing trees and brush from the inside slopes and outer berm, regularly removing sediment from the pond, and removing blockages in the skimmer and riser as necessary.


Based on our preliminary analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway, therefore we will likely not recommend modifications to the spillway. We have included drawings of the proposed outfall structure modifications as Figures 1 & 2.

LIMITATIONS


This evaluation is based only on the aerial topography from December 15, 2022 and visual observation of the outfall structure. Republic should notify Promus prior to beginning work on the pond modifications so that we can verify existing pond conditions and modify our design if necessary. We recommend contracting with a surveyor to prepare a survey of the current pond conditions. The survey should include, at a minimum, existing pond grades, outfall structure detail with pertinent elevations and inverts, and emergency spillway geometry.


